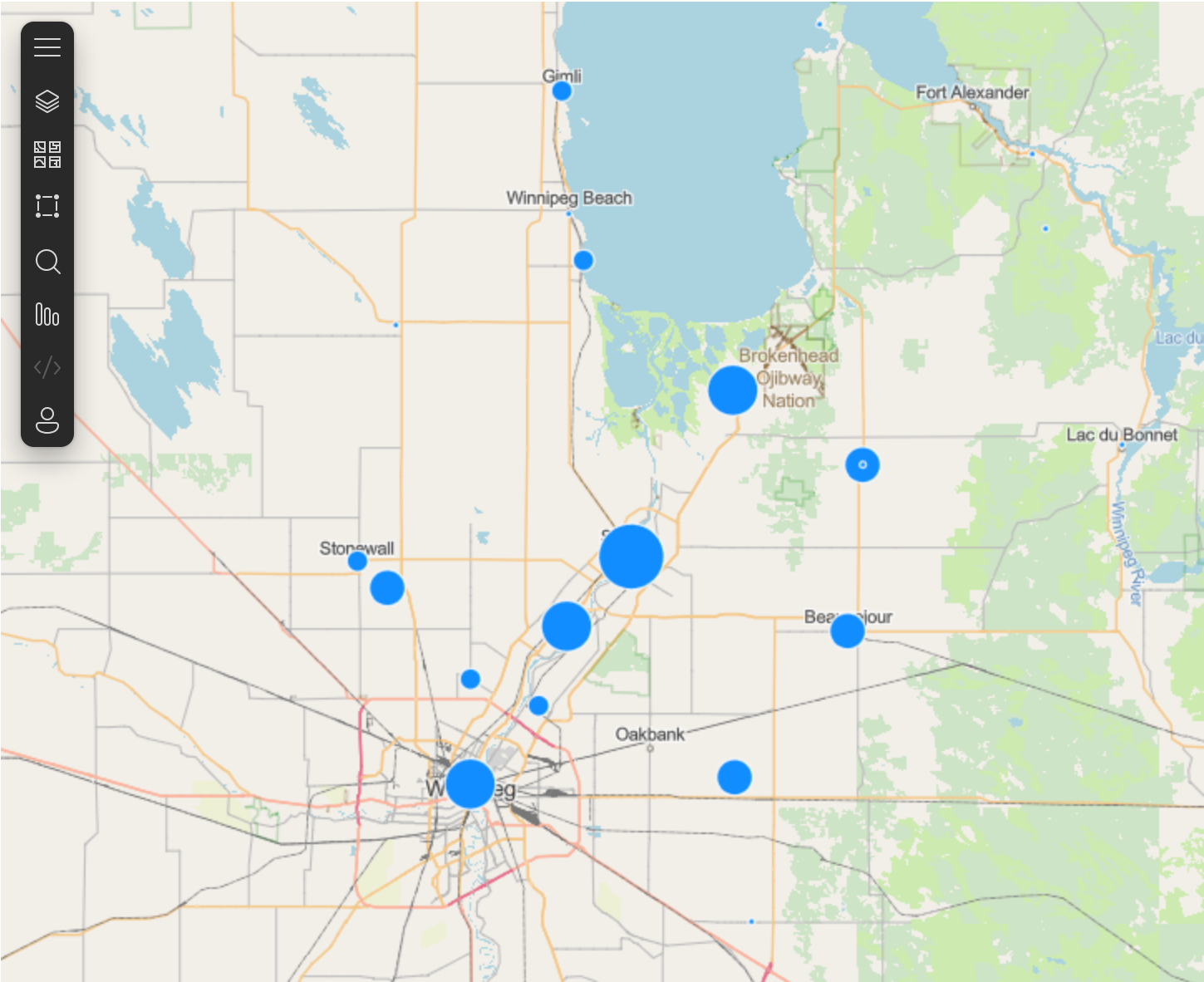

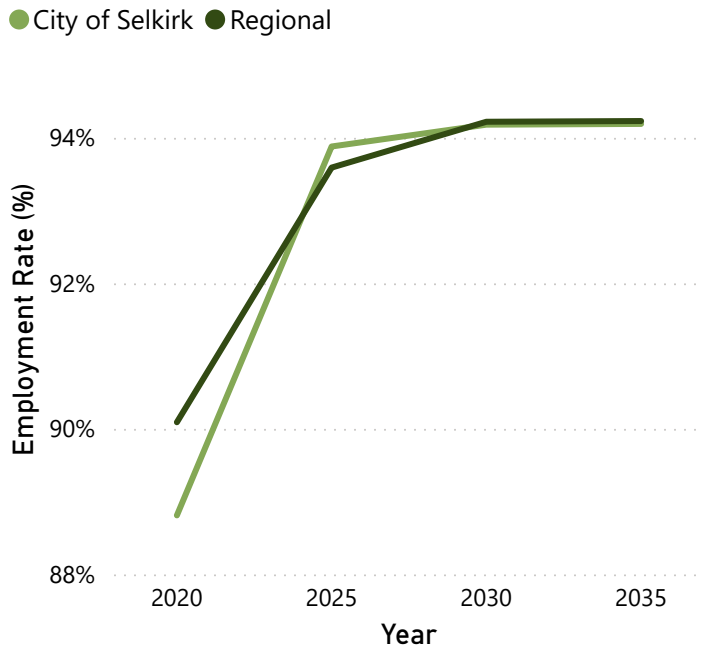

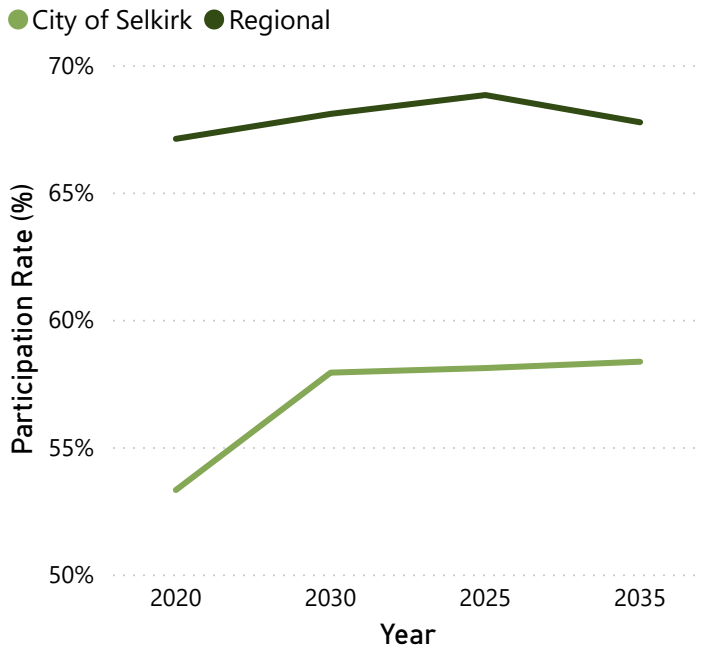

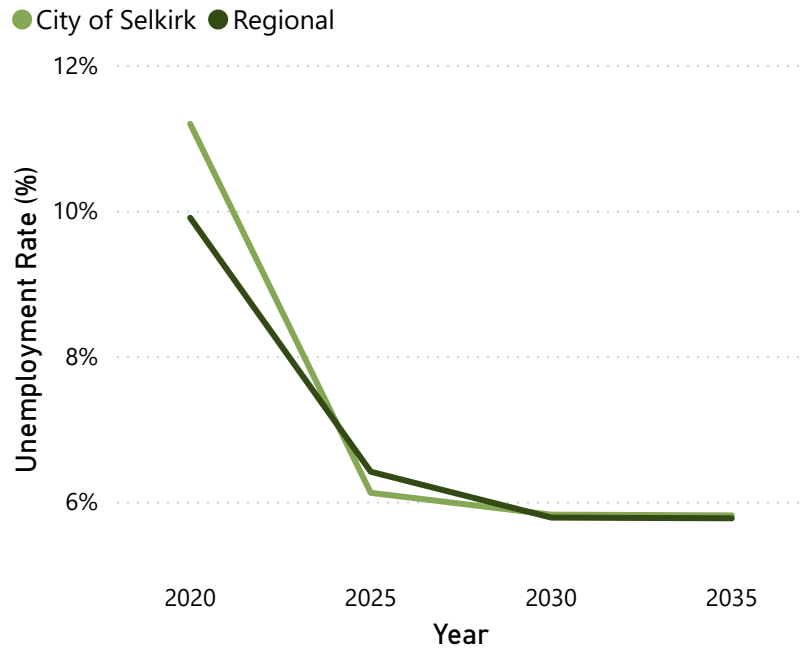
Employment Rate Over Time

(Past, Present & Future)

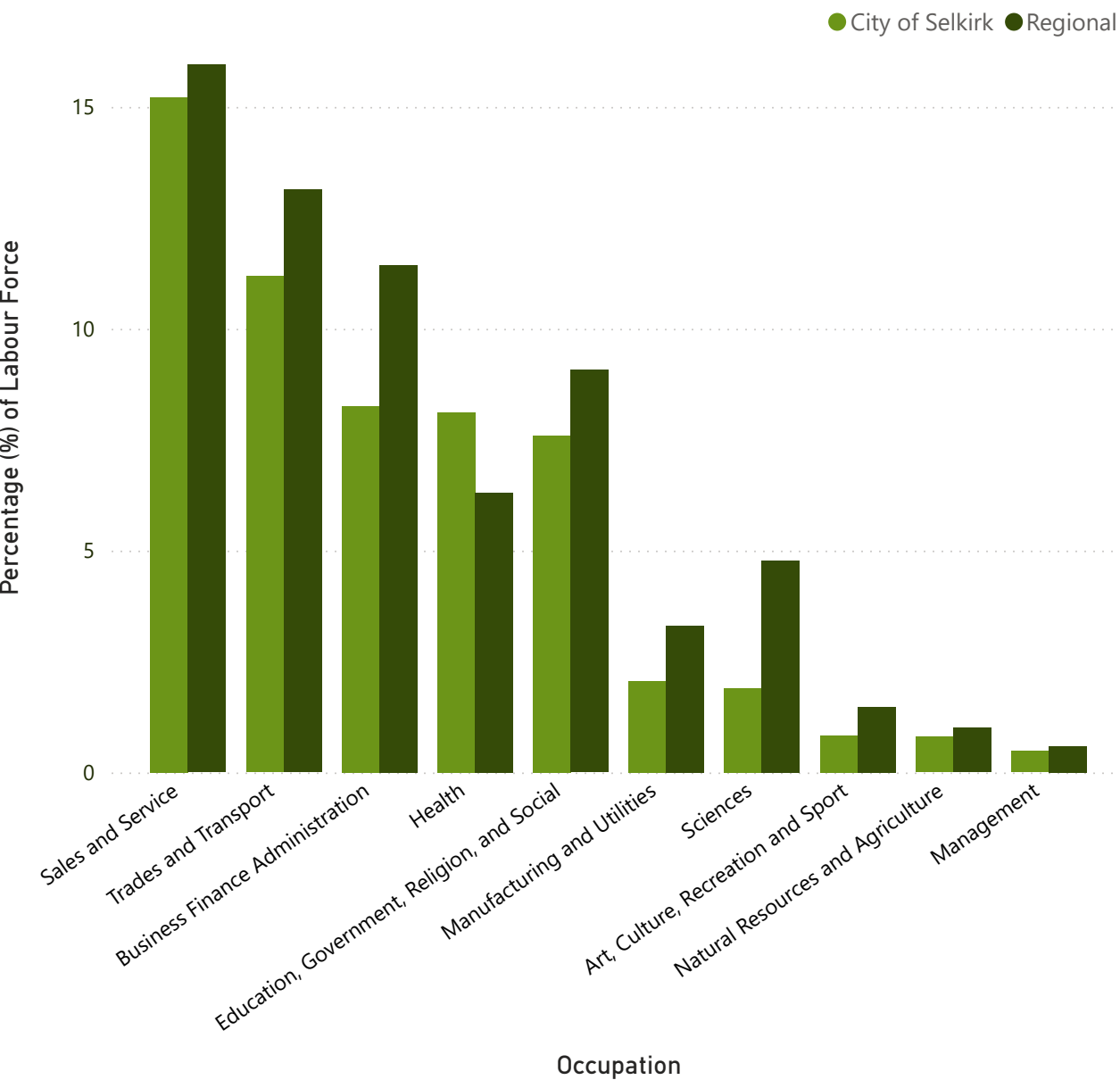

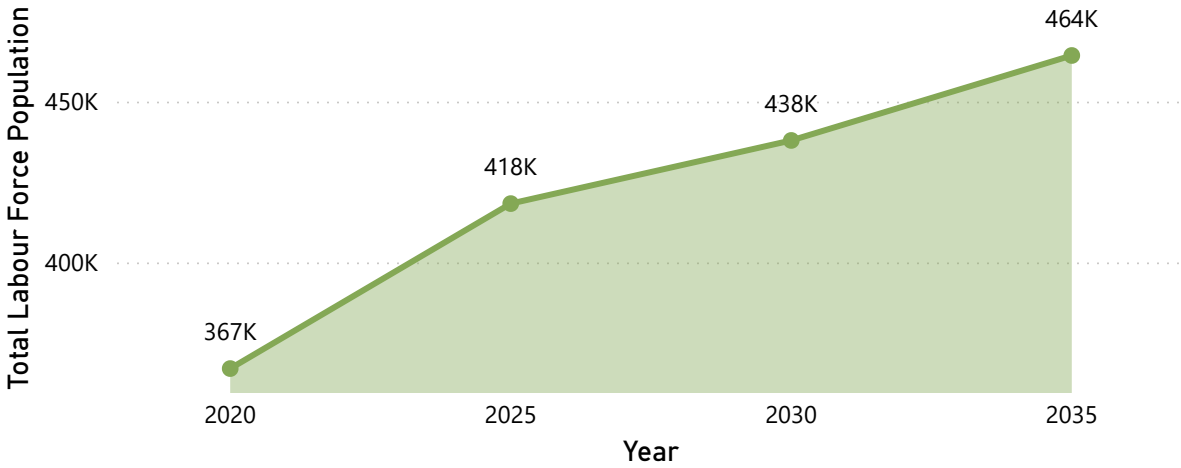
Labour Force by Occupation 2025: City of Selkirk vs. Regional



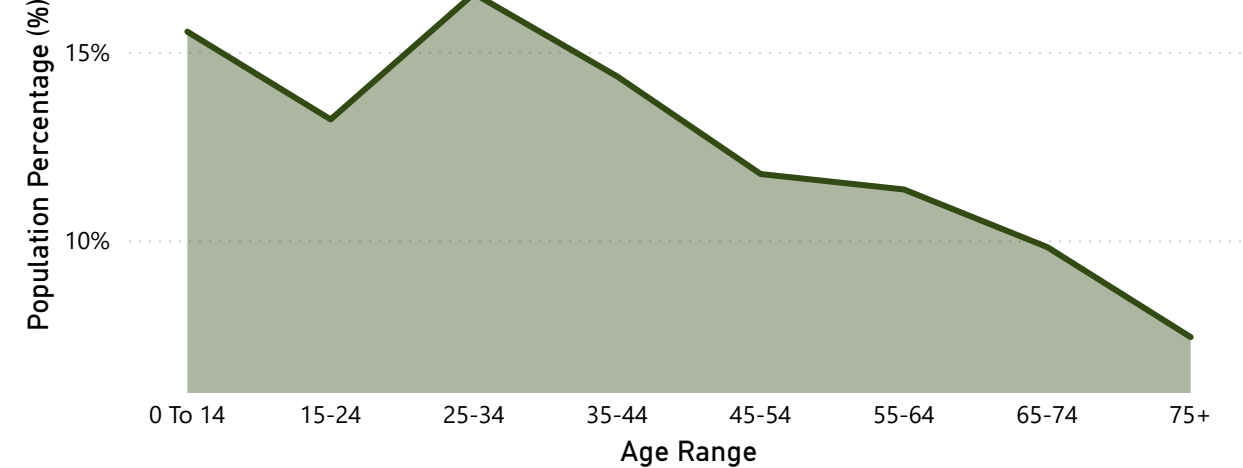

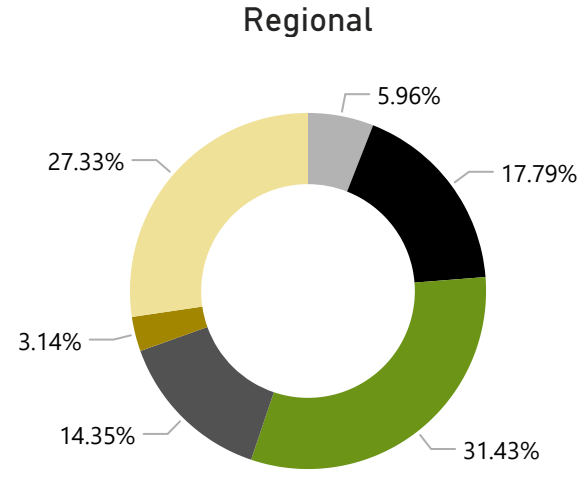
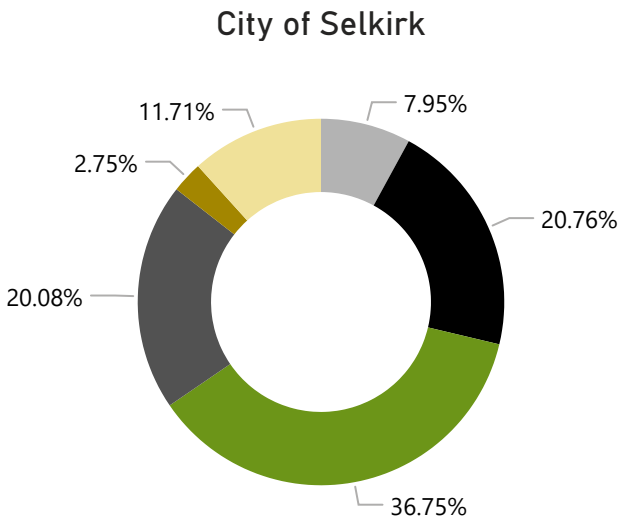


Regional Labour Force Population by Age 2025
